The last year has brought many positive changes to the Thetis Island Community Fund! For example, for the first time since our inception in 2005, we have a full complement of 7 board members. Each person contributes needed skills and experience that have tremendously increased the capacity of the Community Fund to serve our community.

We have a valued and ongoing partnership with TICA to support community access to Forbes Hall and to fundraise jointly in fun ways. Use of the Lifeline button program has doubled, providing that extra peace of mind to those living alone (and their families). We have increased our visibility through regular Quarterly articles, a yearly report to the community, and our website thetisislandcommunityfund.org. All of these are generating valuable feedback, helping to make the Community Fund more meaningful. Design of reports and website, and website administration are mainly inhouse by volunteers, minimizing costs. There's much more to do but we are getting there, together as a community.

It has been a privilege and a pleasure to lead the Community Fund through its beginning phases. I am pleased to continue on the Board as new president Kelly Bannister takes the reigns Nov 1. 

Financial Report - September 2010 through August 2011


Over the last year, disbursements from the Community Fund totaled **\$10,907**, as follows:

- Thetis Island School (through Thetis Island Parents Association) - \$1500
- High school graduate bursaries \$0 (one at \$1000 allocated for Sept 2011)
- Chemainus Hospital Foundation campaign for new X-ray equipment - \$500
- Printed e-spokes \$250
- Life skills and educational training \$3483
- Contribution to TICA (from joint fundraising) - \$1957
- Lifeline buttons \$1602
- First aid course for 18 LERN volunteers -\$1615




Disbursements \$ 10,907 (September 2010 through August 2011)

Net income was \$15,851 over the same period, with over \$4,200 contributed from fundraising events (i.e., flea market, art auction and soiree). Donations totaled over \$11,600.

Funds currently total \$94,850 in cash and investments. Our goal is to grow the investment portion of the fund to \$250,000 to enable strong annual disbursements from the interest generated. We will continue to disburse funds from our annual fundraising campaign, donations and events.

How are funds spent?

While most of us strive to be self-sufficient, there are times when we may require help. The Community Fund is there to help a senior who may need assistance with home care or a family faced with extraordinary health care expenses. As well as these emergency situations, the Fund provides ongoing support through a variety of programs:

- Lifeline Button Service for seniors
- Bursaries for Thetis Island students to assist with postsecondary education
- An Emergency Card system for those evacuated in an emergency without immediate means to pay for a hotel or taxi
- Thetis Island School educational programs and field trips
- Printed copies of e-SPOKES for those without Internet access
- Life skills and educational training for adult students
- Funds to other registered charities whose work benefits Thetis Islanders

How much has been disbursed?

Since 2006, the Community Fund has distributed close to \$50,000 in the following areas: Education (71%); Medical services (15%); Services for seniors (14%).

What is the Community Fund?

Incorporated in December 2005, and receiving charitable status in 2006, the Thetis Island Community Fund is our community charity fund. It was developed to provide an opportunity for all of us to share with our friends and neighbours according to our abilities. The Community Fund provides funds for medical care and treatment, educational funding, support for seniors and support to other registered charities whose work helps Thetis Islanders.

Who manages the fund?

The TICF is managed by a seven-member board including two directors appointed by the Thetis Island Residents & Ratepayers Association (TIRRA) and two by the Thetis Island Community Association (TICA). One member is appointed by the Thetis Island Parents' Association (TIPA) while the remaining two members are board appointed. The board meets every two months and as needed.
